The score is a piano reduction of the German national anthem 'Deutschlandlied' by Joseph Haydn. It is written in 3/4 time, B-flat major, and consists of 17 measures. The score is arranged for piano and features dynamic markings such as *mf*, *p*, *cresc.*, and *f*. The piece begins with a *mf* dynamic and a tempo of 76 beats per minute.
